Philosophy

The Athletic Department is one aspect of the total educational experience at CPCS. Our athletic philosophy is an extension of the philosophy of this school, providing a Christ-centered educational experience teaching "in the light of God's Word."

Purpose

The purpose of the Athletic Department is to provide opportunities for our students to use their God-given talents in the form of physical competition. The CPCS Athletic department promotes honesty, integrity, humility, loyalty, unity and total character development training physically, emotionally, socially and spiritually.

It is the desire of CPCS to have:

Athletes who love God and want Him glorified in their life on or off the court/field, have a respect for authority, a teachable spirit, and a "team" approach.

Coaches who love their athletes and work hard to provide great instruction, emphasize great fundamentals, demand great effort, respect both athletes and parents, and are representatives of Christ's character to other coaches and officials, as well as athletes and parents.

Parents who support and pray for their athletes and coaches, respect the coach's decision even if they don't agree, are concerned for their athlete's character both on and off the field/court, and who represents Christ's character and the school's philosophy at competition both at home and away.

Administration that is organized and enthusiastic about the efforts and successes of its teams, fairly enforces all regulations and guidelines, keeps parents informed in a structured and timely manner, and seeks to continually improve the program of Athletics.

It is our prayer that Christ will be seen and magnified through our Athletic Department as we strive for a dynamic program through a commitment to excellence.

Chain of Command

The Administrator/Middle-High School Principal

The Middle/High School Principal is responsible for the overall administration of the middle school and high school program and its athletic program. The MS/HS Principal is responsible for any official action taken by the school. No formal actions can be taken by the Athletic Director, the coaches or the parents on the school's behalf without consent of the principal. This includes complaints to the FHSAA, other school and the media. The MS/HS Principal coordinates the athletic program into the framework of the other school activities and is the direct supervisor of the Athletic Director.

The Athletic Director

The AD is responsible for the administration and supervision of the athletic program at the school and reports directly to the MS/HS Principal

Athletic Director's Role:

To provide each student the opportunity to be aware of the information and paperwork for each sport, transportation and coaching staff for any sport in which they are eligible to participate. The AD will oversee any questions or concerns regarding eligibility, transportation, behavior, etc. directly with students and, if necessary, their parents.

The Coaches and Assistant Coaches

Coaches are responsible as stewards of the program they oversee. Each coach is directly accountable to the Athletic Director and ultimately to the MS/HS Principal. Assistant coaches are responsible for assisting the Head Coach of their respective sport and directly under them. They are directly responsible to the head coach and ultimately the Athletic director and the MS/HS Principal.

Coach's Role:

The coach of each sport is given primary responsibility over his/her program. This involves oversight of tryouts and player levels (Varsity, JV, Junior High), development of program strategies, encouragement/training of all players in the program and handling of minor team discipline problems with the input of the Athletic Director, if needed. The coach is the individual designated the responsibility to develop the character and physical skills of the athlete in their particular sport. They are to serve the parents by providing an environment of discipline and opportunity for the athletes to grow in character and experience quality competition.

Athlete's Role:

The athlete is the young lady or young man who is given the opportunity to step into the arena of competition on behalf of CPCS and on behalf of our Lord. There is a great responsibility that comes with the opportunity that must not be overlooked in the heat of battle. The defining characteristic of the athlete is their response to adversity and

to winning. Adversity comes in many forms—losing games, bad calls, reduced playing-time, cheap shots from opponents, harsh opposing fans, etc. Our responses as an athlete to these challenges reveal what our priorities are and what we believe. As Christians, we must live our lives by God’s grace in a self-controlled manner on and off the field regardless of what happens to us. When adversity comes, we must allow Christ to be glorified in us by holding our tongue and playing even harder.

In winning, we must also exhibit humility and grace and not be arrogant in any actions towards opponents. When an athlete acts this way, they are merely revealing that they do not have Christ’s glorification as their highest priority, but that it is they who wish the credit for victory.

There is no higher call than to give our last breath to seeing Christ glorified in our lives, and we have not greater opportunity than in the heat of athletic competition to let His light shine in our effort and attitude. CPCS will hold you to that commitment because we know you stand with us in our passion to see Jesus glorified in all things—even athletics.

CPCS Affiliation

CPCS is a recognized 6th-12th grade member of the FHSAA, which allows us to compete against other FHSAA schools.

GRADE LEVEL PARTICIPATION

Athletes **WILL PLAY ON** teams in keeping with their grade level (Exception: upon recommendation by the coach, the Administration and the Athletic Director will consider allowing an athlete to move from a lower team to a higher team). Athletes in grades 6-12 may try out for any sport that has only one level. No “leave of absence” may be taken from the team, unless deemed necessary by the Coach, Athletic Director and Administration.

To try out for the squad, a student (grades 6-12) must meet the current state guidelines. Failure to maintain an overall cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better at the end of each semester in each subject will necessitate withdrawal from the team (see FHSAA Regulations).

Athletes are to maintain exemplary conduct and attitude **AT ALL TIMES**. Failure to do so could result in suspension from the team.

Before the first practice, the following forms are required to be on file in the Athletic Director's or school office.

- ◆**Current Physical Form**
- ◆**Athletic Participation Form**

Student Eligibility (FHSAA)

Citrus Park Christian School is a member of the Florida High School Athletic Association, which is the governing body for the high school athletics. Questions pertaining to FHSAA rules and regulations should be directed to the Athletic Director.

Students in grades 9-12 must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 based on a 4.0 scale to remain eligible.

Students in grades 5-8 must have been regularly promoted from the previous grade, carry a normal class load and maintain a 2.0 GPA to remain eligible.

CPCS reserves the right to impose higher academic standards than those listed above. Students who have earned end of first semester averages below a 2.67, or have three or more grades below C-, or have failed one or more courses, will be restricted from participating in athletics for the second semester. Students who have earned year-end averages below 2.0, or have three or more grades below C-, or have failed one or more courses, will be restricted from participating in athletics for the first semester of the upcoming school year. Students on academic probation may be restricted from participating in athletics.

Eligibility Guidelines

- ◆Must be regularly enrolled and in regular attendance. Home education students must declare in writing his/her intention to participate in athletics at the school prior to the first day of practice. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.1)

- ◆Must enroll in school within 10 days of the beginning of the current school year. If not, all worked missed must be made up before the principal can declare eligibility.

- ◆Must maintain a cumulative 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale through the end of the previous year's semester. For freshmen and sophomores, this GPA must include all courses taken since entering high school. For juniors and seniors, this GPA must include either all courses taken since the beginning of last school year or all courses taken since first entering the ninth grade, whichever is the most beneficial.

- ◆Sixth-graders, seventh-graders and eighth-graders must have been regularly promoted from the previous grade, carry a 2.0 grade point average at the end of the 1st and 2nd semester and maintain a satisfactory conduct record.

- ◆Must not have graduated from any high school or its equivalent. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.2)

- ◆Must participate at the school of first enrollment, or at which you first take part in an athletic practice, at the beginning of the school year.

- ◆Must transfer from previous school prior to the first day of practice and secure an "Application for Waiver of the Transfer Rule" signed by the principal of both the

previous school and the new school. If the transfer occurs on or after the first day of practice in a sport, the student cannot participate in that sport. If the student transfers from a school at which he was ineligible because of disciplinary action or unsatisfactory conduct, he will be ineligible at the new school for one full semester. If the student participates on a non-school team (i.e. AAU, American Legion, club settings, etc.), which is affiliated with or coached by a coach from a school other than the one you attend, or have attended, and then transfer to that school, it will be assumed that the student has been recruited to attend that school, and the athlete will be ineligible there for one year (FHSAA Bylaw 11.4).

- ◆Must not have entered the 10th grade more than three years ago, if you are a sophomore, junior, or senior.
- ◆Freshmen must have successfully completed the eighth grade at the end of the last school year.
- ◆Must be less than 19 years 9 months old to participate in high school; 16 years 9 months old to participate in junior high school; and 15 years 9 months old to participate in middle school. On the day the student reaches one of these ages (regardless of when that day is) he will become ineligible to participate on that level.
- ◆Must get signed permission to participate from parents or guardian on a form provided by the school. (FHSAA Bylaw 11.7)
- ◆Must have a physician's certificate stating that the athlete is physically fit for interscholastic athletic competition.
- ◆The certificate must be dated any time between June 1 and one day before the first practice of the current school year (FHSAA Bylaw 11.8)
- ◆Must be an amateur. This means the student must not accept money, gift, or donation for participating in a sport, or use a name other than your own when participating (FHSAA 11.9).
- ◆Must not participate in an all-star contest in a sport prior to completing your high school eligibility in that sport (FHSAA Bylaw 11.10).
- ◆Must display good sportsmanship and follow the rules of competition in every contest in which there is participation. If not, the student may be barred from participating for a period of time (FHSAA Bylaw 11.11).
- ◆Must not provide false information to the school or FHSAA to gain eligibility.

Limit of Eligibility

- ◆Each student shall have four consecutive year of eligibility beginning when they first enter 9th grade.
- ◆Four years from the date he/she entered 9th grade, students shall become ineligible for all interscholastic sports.
- ◆Middle School students may participate in interscholastic athletics one year as eighth graders, one year as seventh graders, and one year as 6th graders. Middle school students repeating any grade may not participate in interscholastic athletics during their second year in grades 6, 7 or 8.
- ◆A student must be less than 19 years, 9 months of age to participate in high school athletics.

Transfer Students

A student will be eligible at the school in which he/she first enrolls each school year or at the school in which he/she becomes a candidate for an athletic team by engaging in a practice that begins prior to the start of the school year. Student's enrollment in a school, will render the student ineligible in the new school for the duration of that school year, unless he/she applies for and is granted an undue hardship waiver by the sectional appeals committee.

Non-School Competition

Participation by a student in non-school competition (i.e. AAU, USVA, American Legion, Club settings, etc.), as a member of a team that is affiliated with any school other than the school which the student attends, followed by a transfer by that student to that school, shall be considered prima facie evidence that the student was recruited by the school to which he/she transferred. Unless prima facie evidence of recruiting is disproved by the school and the student to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, the student shall be ineligible to represent that school in interscholastic athletic competition for a period of 265 consecutive days from the date of his/her enrollment in that school.

A team affiliated with a school is one that is organized by and/or coached by any member of the coaching staff at, or any other person affiliated with, that school; and/or on which the majority of the members of the team (participants in practice and/or competitions) are students who attended that school.

Pre-Season Parent Meetings

It is mandatory that each coach (with the assistance of the Athletic Director) holds a meeting with parents and prospective players for his/her team in the pre-season. This will afford the players' parents the opportunity to get to know each other, the coach and the support staff. This will also provide the Athletic Director and the coach an opportunity to communicate any special rules or guidelines he/she may have for their team and anticipated expenses for the parents in that sport. This is a mandatory meeting for parents. Athletes are not required to attend.

Attendance in School

Students must be in attendance the entire school day in order to engage in practice or participate in a contest. If a student has a medical appointment, he/she must provide written documentation of the appointment from the doctor and attend more than one-half of his/her classes in order to participate that day.

School sponsored field trips are considered an excused absence from school. Students are expected to be at all practices and games unless absent from school. Students may be dismissed from a team after three unexcused absences.

Attendance for Practice & Games

Prior notice is to be given to the coach for any absences. If prior notice is possible, but neglected, the absence will be counted unexcused. The following are considered as excused absences:

- ◆Illness
- ◆Unavoidable medical appointments
- ◆Death in family
- ◆Private academic tutoring (should be scheduled before school or Wednesday afternoon)
- ◆Special family situations (weddings, counseling, etc.) with prior approval of the coach.
- ◆Special church activities (when choosing to attend a special activity, keep in mind the attendance policy for lettering and the pressure imposed on the team by your attendance). Prior approval must be granted by the coach.

Unexcused absences to practices will receive the following:

- ◆1st absence: Lost practice time will be made up individually
- ◆2nd absence: Suspension from participating in upcoming game
- ◆Tardiness: Discipline will be at the discretion of the coach
- ◆An unexcused absence to a game can result in expulsion from the team

Practice schedules and times

Most athletic practices will begin immediately after school. There is generally no Wednesday practice unless called by the coach with the approval of the administration and Athletic Director.

Practice

- ◆Devotions and prayer must be a part of each practice
- ◆Practice is off-limits to an athlete who has been absent the school day.
- ◆Non-team members are not to be in the gym during practice. Outsiders are not to be involved in practice unless invited by the coach.
- ◆No loitering outside of gym or away from coach's supervision is permitted.
- ◆Gum may not be chewed at practice, games (on campus at any time) or on the bus.
- ◆All water bottles, clothes, towels, etc. are to be removed from the gym after practice.

Practice Clothing

Coaches may require team members to purchase practice clothing bearing the school name and sport. All practice clothing will be ordered through the athletic office and paid for by the student at the time of ordering.

Students are not permitted to wear clothing that is revealing and/or makes reference to alcohol, tobacco, drugs, profanity, Satan or other offensive symbols. Length of shorts is knee length and worn at the waistline.

Method of Selecting Teams

Tryouts are open to all academically eligible students. No student will be cut from a team until the third day after the official start of practice. Students who cannot begin practice on the first official practice date due to overlapping sports will be given three days after the conclusion of their season to try out for a team.

Team Rosters

The number of athletes on each team will vary. Students added to a team roster after the first contest of the season must wait one day after submission of their names to FHSAA before they can participate in a contest.

Uniform Replacement Policy

Varsity uniforms will be purchased on a need basis (usually every 3-4 years). Due to the nature of certain sports, some uniforms will last longer than 4 years and some less than 4 years. JV and JH uniforms will be purchased on a need basis (usually every 6-7 years). Changes in style or fashion do not warrant purchasing new uniforms if the current uniform is still in good condition.

If the majority of the team's uniforms are in good or excellent condition and less than $\frac{1}{4}$ in fair or poor condition, replacing the entire set is not necessary if matching replacement uniforms can be purchased.

Whenever possible, varsity and junior varsity uniforms shall be identical. This allows for greater flexibility in sizing. Whenever possible, varsity uniforms will be passed down to the junior varsity, and junior varsity uniforms will be passed down to the junior high. This will not be done if the uniforms are in poor condition or do not fit the majority of the team properly.

The funding for new uniforms shall come from the athletic budget, individual sports budgets or the booster club.

Student Managers

Student managers are valuable assets to our athletic teams. Students desiring to serve as managers should contact the head coach. Student managers are required to meet and follow all rules and regulations pertaining to athletics and may earn varsity letters by meeting the same criteria as team members.

Home School Athletes

To be eligible to play on a CPCS team, home school athletes are required to pay the registration fee and the sport fee for each sport played, as well as meet all of the same requirements of a CPCS athlete. Homeschool athletes **MUST** complete all FHSAA requirements.

Athletic Camps

Coaches will conduct sports camps during the summer to refine the athlete's skills. All athletes are encouraged to attend.

Leave of Absence/Withdrawal From Sport

No "leave of absence" may be taken by an athlete from the team, unless deemed necessary by the Coach, Athletic Director and Administration. If an athlete quits a sport during the season, except for injury, he/she will be ineligible to play any upcoming sport during that school year.

Weight Room Use

No student is permitted to use the weight room without direct supervision from an CPCS coach. Students must have proper workout attire consisting of a clean, dry t-shirt, athletic shorts, socks and athletic shoes (no cleats). Students must remove all jewelry before entering the weight room.

No food or drinks are permitted at anytime. Students are responsible for cleaning up the weight room after each use. Violations for weight room rules or policies may result in a loss of privileges.

Transportation To and From Games

Only athletes, coaches, and managers are permitted to use school transportation. Athletes must ride the school bus to and from an away game. An athlete may return home with his/her parent, but not friends. The following guidelines are to be observed on the bus:

- ◆CD/IPOD, etc, are to have approved music only.
- ◆Talk is to be quiet.
- ◆Rowdiness is not allowed.
- ◆Athletes must be seated at all times while on the bus.
- ◆Misconduct and inappropriate language will be dealt with immediately and reported to the Athletic Director.
- ◆No food or drinks are to be consumed on the bus without the approval of the driver.
- ◆Athletes are to clean the bus before leaving.

Dress Code

Students must travel to and from games in team uniforms, team warm-ups, team shirts, shirt and tie, or school dress code. Students are to look neat and clean at all times when representing CPCS. Uniform shirts and/or dress shirts must be completely tucked in and pants worn at the natural waistline.

Students are not permitted to wear jewelry, including body piercing or bandannas during practices or games. Boys may not have facial hair and must have the appropriate hair code.

Care of Gym

After each practice and game, athletes are to remove all clothes, water bottles, etc. from the bench area and move furniture and chairs as directed by the coach. The gym is to be left clean and neat in appearance.

Care of Locker Room

Conduct of the athletes is to be orderly in the locker room. No loud yelling or horseplay is to take place. During practice and games, books, clothes and valuables are to be locked up in the locker room. No player may leave the locker room until the locker room and restroom are clean and free of clothing and trash.

Discipline

Athletes are under the same discipline policy and subject to the same penalties as listed in the *Parent/Student Handbook*.

Spectator conduct

Everyone associated with an athletic event plays an important role in seeing that standards of sportsmanship are upheld. Fans are reminded that their sportsmanship and behavior reflects upon the reputation of CPCS. A spectator should:

- ◆ Demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- ◆ Respect, cooperate, and respond enthusiastically to cheerleaders.
- ◆ Censor fellow spectators who display negative behavior.
- ◆ Respect the property of the school and the authority of school officials.
- ◆ Never heckle, jeer, or distract members of opposing teams.
- ◆ Never criticize the athletes or coaches for the loss of a contest.
- ◆ Accept the decisions of the officials.

Playing Time

Because playing time depends on so many variables, we cannot guarantee that every athlete will play in every game. Playing time depends on these factors:

- ◆ God given ability of the athlete
- ◆ Time spent practicing prior to the season
- ◆ Attitude of the athlete in practice and in games
- ◆ Strength or weakness of the opponent
- ◆ Athlete's work ethic in practice
- ◆ Number of practices attended or missed
- ◆ Injuries to oneself or a teammate
- ◆ Number of players on the team eligible to play in a given game
- ◆ Respect to coach and teammates
- ◆ A teachable spirit
- ◆ Good sportsmanship

Award/Letters Policy

One purpose of an athletic award is to recognize an athlete's God-given ability and achievement and to motivate the athlete to be the best that he/she can be. Various trophies, plaques and certificates will be given out that will be sport-specific.

Awards

At the end of each sports season, awards will be given to athletes in all levels at an awards banquet. To receive an earned award, the athlete is required to be present at the awards banquet unless there is a valid reason that is deemed such by the administration.

Letters

Varsity Letters are awarded to athletes who have:

- ◆Shown good sportsmanship/attitude.
- ◆Fulfill the playing requirements for that sport.
- ◆Shown a certain level of skill to be determined by the coach.
- ◆Managers who meet the above requirements will be eligible to letter.

The CPCS Athletic Director will give you important information at the beginning of the school year on the use of this valuable tool.
